


Seafarers' Access

- 1. Part of 2010 USCG Authorization
- 2. Section 811: "SEAMEN'S SHORESIDE ACCESS. Each facility security plan approved under section 70103(c) of title 46, United States Code, shall provide a system for seamen assigned to a vessel at that facility, pilots, and representatives of seamen's welfare and labor organizations to board and depart the vessel through the facility in a timely manner at no cost to the individual."
- 3. NPRM: 12/29/2014
- 4. Public Hearing: 1/23/15
- 5. At Office of Management & Budget waiting to be issued

Aspects of Rule

- Each owner or operator of a MTSA-regulated facility to implement a system for providing seafarers and other individuals with access between vessels moored at the facility and the facility gate.
- "Individuals covered", would list individuals covered by seafarers' access requirements. The proposed paragraph (b) lists:
 - Seafarers assigned to a vessel moored at the facility;
 - vessel pilots and other authorized personnel performing work for a vessel moored at a facility (to cover individuals that are not considered seafarers or pilots);
 - representatives of seafarers' welfare and labor organizations; and
 - other authorized individuals, in accordance with a DoS or other arrangement between the vessel and facility, to cover visitors to a vessel other than representatives of seafarers' welfare and labor organizations.
- This is a 24/7 rule
- If cleared to enter facility, will shift access to SSO for "individuals covered"
- Will probably have an 18 month implementation period
- Rumors that it may drop this year





Current Status:

- Vessel Traffic Allowed in Hatched Area shown in Figure with limitation put on tugs.
- Wall and temporary protection is being monitored by DD7 and USACE.

Emergency Procedures



Emergency Procedure

- Emergency Situation must meet the definition in 33 CFR 325.2(e)(4)
 - Definition: An "emergency" is a situation which would result in an unacceptable hazard to life, a significant loss of property, or an immediate, unforeseen, and significant economic hardship if corrective action requiring a permit is not undertaken within a time period less than the normal time needed to process the application under standard procedures.
 - Emergency Situation must need work to be performed near the time of the cause and/or discovery of the problem/need.
 - If it's going to take months to plan and/or fund, this is not considered an Emergency per the Regulatory Program.



Emergency Procedure (cont'd)

- Initially providing information on what work needs to be done is needed with the Emergency Request.
 - A full set of Engineering Plans & Specs is not required at this time.
- Emergency Request goes up through Division for Authorization.
- State and Federal agencies will still be called to inform them and allow comment on the project.
- A federally complete application which includes a set of plans showing all impacts to waters of the US will be required after the emergency procedure letter is issued.
- Only one Emergency Procedure Request was approved through Division during Hurricane Harvey.






